FALL CLASSES BEGIN ONLINE

It's fall and that means new classes are beginning after a brief summer vacation. Unlike past years, now all the classes are meeting virtually. In the midst of this change, LVCC is so happy that both students and tutors have eagerly participated in "Zoom school" for the new and returning classes. To celebrate this fact, and in honor of November's designation as National Family Literacy Month, LVCC would like to put the focus on two classes that have promoted literacy through pleasure reading activities.

The first is the new Family Literacy Workshop, which uses children's books to promote literacy activities. In October LVCC started the first session of this six-week workshop. Students in both programs attend the sessions with their children, where BL Coordinator Charlotte leads discussions on various methods to promote reading and increase family engagement. During each class, participants practice different strategies which can be applied over various genres and grade levels in an effort to promote literacy activities among all members of a household.

Also this October, the ESL Book Club began their fall session. This fall the seven participants are reading *No Return Address* by Gail Anderson-Dargatz, a novel about family relationships as it pertains to love and loss. Over the course of 11 weeks they will meet to discuss the readings with each other and book club moderator Angela. These lively and engaging meetings encourage pleasure reading through different works of fiction.

Through these topical classes, while reading for themselves or their children, students are strengthening the skills that they are learning in their tutoring sessions. Can't wait to see what they read next!

New Readers Press Online Learning: HiSET Prep




Don't Forget the News!
