Each passage has associated questions after it to help gage the comprehension and context of the passage. Tutors will have to create a free log-in to access the material on these websites.

Short Story Passages

Whether looking at a news article or a short passage, online stories can provide great reading materials on topical subjects from current events to familiar subject matter that can help provide context to your student.

Some strategies for using these resources include pre-reading activities with photographs and headlines, pulling out unfamiliar vocabulary terms, and searching for main ideas.

History Channel Stories

The History Channel has an archive of articles based on past events – some little known. It can be fun to discover new things like a potential werewolf in France - is it true? These are great for reading and discussion.

Mometrix offers testing practice for both the HiSET and CASAS tests. Explore the website to see everything that it has to offer!





PURPLE MATH






Math Visuals

From cubes to shapes to number boards, all your favorite physical manipulatives can be found here!





These short stories (usually less than 5 minutes) can work as a conversation starter on unfamiliar words, topics, or a discussion on thoughts about the story.




